# WHY IS LEARNING THE LANGUAGES OF APPRECIATION IMPORTANT IN THE WORKPLACE?


- Common language can help build better working relationships
- Appreciation demonstrates value
- Only 1/3 workers in the U.S. strongly agree that they received recognition or praise for doing good work in the past 7 days (Gallup, 2016)
- 48% of American's working population is actively job searching or looking for new opportunities (Gallup, 2021)

• Good relationships, consistent feedback, and good management practices show employees that they matter


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


